



We are currently kicking off a project Denton, TX along SL 288. It's a approx. 6.5mi roadway reconstruction involving multiple interchanges, bridges, ramps and frontage roads. It's a massive project in terms of coordination with multiple entities as well as several right-of-way constraints in addition to alternative alignment analysis on a congested segment of SL 288 which connects to US 380. It's an exciting hallmark project for us and we are glad to be a part of it!

A scholarship program known as the Friends of Civil Engineering brought me to both Civil Engineering and ASCE. The program includes a full scholarship to UTA to pursue Civil Engineering at The University of Texas at Arlington and involves leadership development and mentorship to civil engineering students. 
